Report Card



We are using **MyEducation BC (MyEdBC) PARENT PORTAL** which provides parents a new way to access their child's school information directly online. With this portal account, you will be able to view attendance, term grades, and other information about your child(ren). The MyEducationBC application is a secure portal used in most school districts in the province of BC.

On February 6th, new parents received an email with their login ID and temporary password to access their account at <https://www.myeducation.gov.bc.ca/aspden/logon.do> (link is external) (link is external).

Each parent/guardian has their own separate account. You will need to log into the account in order to update your password and gain access to the portal. Please follow the instructions outlined in the email to login to your account:

2. Make sure popups are enabled for your browser.

NOTE: Both user name and password are case sensitive.

5. Enter your user name and password then click "Log On" to access the system. You will be prompted to change your password, and fill out some information so that in the future you can click "I forgot my password" to receive a new password.

Dressing for the Weather



With the arrival of January, we are guaranteed to see wet, windy, west coast weather. Outdoor play continues to be vitally important to our overall health and has been shown to provide a huge number of benefits including improved executive function, stress reduction, and improved sleep (and what parent doesn't like that!).

It is so important that students are dressed appropriately for these conditions. We would appreciate your support in ensuring that your child arrives at school with warm, water resistant/waterproof clothing: a jacket/poncho (preferably with a hood) and closed shoes (rain boots, if possible). Unless it is raining heavily, our students do go out for recess, exercise activities, or neighbourhood walks. Some field trips also involve students being outdoors, even when the weather is wet. Modesty

‘Every deen (religion) has an innate character.
The character of Islam is modesty.’

Prophet Muhammad (P.B.U.H)
Malik – Book 47 – Hadith 47.2.9

Modesty plays a vital role in character building. It restrains a man from behaving in an undesirable manner. It also acts as a shield against immoralities. It holds the key to piety.

It is stated by Zaid bin Talha that the Holy Prophet (peace be upon him) said:

“Every [religion](#) has a distinctive quality and the distinctive quality of Islam is modesty”

The Hadith shows that in every faith, some particular aspects of moral behavior receives importance and an extraordinary emphasis is laid on it; in Islam modesty is of fundamental significance.

Meaning of Modesty in Islam

- Being aware of what is right and what is wrong and refraining from it due to fear or shame.
- Being modest in front of a parent, would be to talk politely.
- Being modest in front of a teacher would be to have respect while gaining knowledge.
- Being modest on the street is to walk in an orderly manner with appropriate clothing.
- Being modest in front of friends would be to refrain from mentioning family problems.
- Being modest in general is to keep your dignity and respect others without anyone pointing fingers.
- Being modest in front of Allah is to guard your brain and stomach from Haram things.
