Principal's Message

Medical Forms (Anaphylaxis) were sent home on September 8th. Please review them carefully to ensure we have accurate information for your child. Make the necessary changes and sign and date the form and return it by October 3rd. Thank you very much for helping us ensure that we have accurate information.

Foundation Skills Assessment (FSA) – Each year, students in Grades 4 and 7 in BC take part in the Foundation Skills Assessment (FSA), an assessment of reading comprehension, writing and numeracy. The main purpose of the assessment is to help the province, school districts and schools track how well students are learning core academic skills. The information is used at the Ministry, District, and school level to set goals for improving student learning. This year, the FSA's will be administered in October and November.

Parents contacting teachers – We all recognize that parent/teacher communication and teamwork are essential to student success. As such, we want to be accessible to parents to deal with concerns or questions that may arise. We want to ensure that parents and teachers can have a focused conversation that is not hindered either because the children are in class or because the teacher may have a prior commitment. The best way to ensure that your concerns are heard and given the attention they deserve is to contact your child's teacher by e-mail to make an appointment at a time that works for both of you. Parents it is important to sign up/sign In for the **SMS APP** and check it regularly to know what your child is learning and to be on the same page.

Traffic Safety Concerns – Congestion and parking are frustrating issues at most schools. Together, we can ensure the safety of all our students by taking a little extra time and exercising caution and common sense. Please adhere to school zone speed limits, as well as parking rules. If you are stopping to drop off or pick up your child, please **park and walk** your child to their teacher. Parking is limited, so arrive early, please kindly avoid backing up when you drop off your child(ren) always avoid parking near the bus. This will help us to maximize safety and reduce frustration.

Interim Report Cards

Interim Report Cards will be issued on October 31st, 2022. Interims help parents stay on top of their child's progress in each subject, and because they're usually issued halfway through a grading period, they also give families a chance to correct any academic problems that exist.

For example, a teacher might indicate that your student is having trouble paying attention in class, or that your child is courteous, responsible, and helpful to others. Sometimes interim reports also request a parent/teacher conference, especially if there are academic or social problems involving the student.



Pay close attention to the teacher's comments. This information provides key insights into what your child needs to change or improve on as well as what they are doing well.

Safety and security are important at our school. Our “Safe Welcome” program involves cameras installed, and door visitors buzz.

Parents/guardians and visitors must not enter the school unless otherwise authorized by the administration.

All parents are reminded to call the front office to kindly request a meeting with the principle instead of dropping-in. Any parents or guardians dropping in will be asked to make an appointment and return at a later time.

Nutrition

Parents are requested to send their children to school each day with nutritious food that provide health and energy that leads to increase academic performances.

Foods which contain large amounts of sugar may affect behaviour adversely. Studies show that students who have sufficient nutrition in their diets perform better at school. Drinking water throughout the day significantly enhances student performance.

Anaphylaxis

In cases where a student is anaphylactic, parents/guardians are expected to provide the school with EPI-Pen(s) for their child.

Parents/Guardians must also work with the school to develop an Individual Medical Management Plan that outlines emergency procedures for their child. Letter will be sent to parents early September.

The school must administer an EPI-Pen when a student is suspected of suffering an anaphylactic reaction even if no Individual Medical Management Plan exists.
