- Link movies to books. Your middle schooler, like many others, may enjoy watching movies during winter break. Encourage them to watch at least one based on a book--and read the book first.

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- Have your child(ren) pray on time so that school and home are on the same page.
- Make sure your child has the Duaa copy with them before the Winter Break!
- Have them recite Qur'an regularly during the break so that they are ready for the upcoming Qur'an Competition.



Surrey Muslim School is an independent school that abides by the BC Ministry of Education rules, regulations and requirements. As all parents know, a pivotal part of the registration process is for our school to attain several legal documents from each family. The process of obtaining and updating such documents is an essential requirement from the BC Ministry of Education. Our administrative team are responsible for collecting specific documents from you as well as ensuring they are up to date by calling and or emailing you and kindly requesting a specific document to add to your child's file. Failure to cooperate with our administrative team in providing such document will result in your child / children becoming ineligible for government funding at BC Muslim School.

Our administrative team is dedicated to all their responsibilities and to protect them, the Surrey Muslim School would like all students, parents and guardians to know that our school has established a Zero Tolerance Policy against all our students, faculty and staff. Since our administrative team is the first face parents see and communicate with, we would like to take the chance to kindly remind parents that they must exercise respect and professionalism when dealing and communicating with our Administrative team.

Emergency Unscheduled Closures



As winter weather approaches, we want to remind parents/guardians of the School's winter weather procedures and announcements. In the event of an unscheduled school closure caused by snow, emergency, or extraordinary circumstances, the school closure will be decided by 6:15 a.m. at the latest, and will be announced through **EMAIL** and **SMS App.** As house calls will not be made we urge parents to join SMS App as soon as possible. Families are encouraged to establish an emergency plan for their children in the event that schools are closed, school's start time is delayed, or students are dismissed early.

As always, it is a parent's decision whether to send their child to school based on safety and individual circumstances. If you feel it is unsafe for you or your child to travel to or attend an open school for any reason, please keep your child home and report an absence to the school.

The higher grades will focus on preparing Spoken Word, which is an elevated form of poetry, where students will require to choose a topic that is meaningful to them. We encourage students to find a topic they can make deep connections with and something they are truly passionate about. On December 15, the top three poets from each class will come to present their piece in Assembly in front of their peers. We look forward to hearing some creative poetry!





Honesty was one of the prophets (PUH) characteristics. He was called the truthful and the trustworthy.

Islam is distinguished by good manners, and it takes overspreading the best manners among the believers. Honesty is one of the most important characteristics the Muslim should be characterized with. Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) was described as being truthful and honest before his prophethood.

What is honesty?

Honesty is defined as saying the truth without changing it. It means to do what you say and that all your deeds are identical to all your sayings. Honesty and truthfulness are considered the weapons of the believers in the battle against the falsehood on earth. They are the merits of those who believe in Allah (SWT) as the only God to be worshipped and that Muhammad is the Messenger of Allah.

Honesty always gives strength, reassurance, and self-confidence to the honest person, unlike the liar who always feels afraid of being disclosed and despised by people when they find out his/her reality.

The Arabic word for honesty is "al Amanah" which means trustworthy. That is to give people their rights and to render back the belongings that are kept with you and to keep these rights for them.

Building Honesty

The important question to be asked, however, is this: How does Islam build honesty in the Muslim? Islam builds ethical qualities in general and honesty in particular in several ways:

- 1. Instructions. Allah orders the Muslim to be honest in all cases, in all deeds and words, to himself and others.
- 2. Reason. Allah shows the Muslim rationally that honesty is the best policy, even on utilitarian bases.
- 3. Reward. Allah promises the honest person generous rewards in the first life and in the second life.
- 4. Punishment. Allah threatens the dishonest person with severe punishment for his dishonest behavior.

5. Practice. Allah develops the habit of honesty in the Muslim through actual practice, i.e., through fasting and prayer.

Thus Islam builds the habit of honesty in the Muslim through direct instructions, through rational arguments, through the reward and punishment principles, and through practice.

TIPS TO BUILD EMOTIONAL Resilience in Kids and

Spend quality time with kids. When they feel loved and supported, children develop emotional strength.

Instead of rushing to solve problems, give kids time to work things out themselves. Talk about feelings so your child learns to share their worries and fears with the people they trust.

When children experience failure or disappointment, it's important to praise their effort and encourage them to try again.

Acknowledge your own mistakes to teach kids that mistakes are essential for learning and Growth.


If your child can't find a solution to a problem, use gentle questioning to guide them towards it.

Ensure kids are eating well and getting enough sleep and exercise



10 Things Children Want From their Parents

- Show them that you love them
- Be patient with them as they learn new things
- Hear them out and let them vent without any judgements.

- That you trust them to make their own choices.
